It is raining today so I'll take time to catch up on some correspondence.

First I want to thank you ~~att~~ both for Jane Anne Way's necklace. She was so pleased. I had no idea she was named for so many people. She is a great pleasure to us. She's as busy as an ant and as noisy as a magpie. She is under foot all day while the children are at school. Her hair is about like mine was when I was 10. Tall like her daddy and blue eyes. She misses mother.

Dad, David and Graham put cement curb around Mother's plot at the cemetery. Dad got a small marker of blue granite

and the lot looks nice as it could
on that dry old hill. We have
kept flowers and the basket of
everlasting boquet you folks sent
on the grave. Will plant iris
and tulips next time I go down.

Now about our moving.

We recieved about \$3,000. from a
trust fund Grahams mother had
the use of during her life time.
Our dairy was slowly decreasing
there and we had a hard time
making a living. We bought
this little farm of forty
acres with 22 head of gurnsey
cattle 27 head of chester white
hogs and 60 white rock chickens
all crops and machinery.
and paid our debts sold out
at Forsyth. I hated to leave
Dad there but we were afraid

if we stayed there we would just spend the money and get nothing to show for it.

Dad is getting old and his rupture is so bad he may not be able to work long so this way we have a place for him if he will come and stay with us.

We couldn't buy your house we felt we had to make the most of this legacy as it is all we ever expect to have.

Bob is in Circle. He is transferred anywhere the Highway feel like sending him. They don't own their own furniture as it is too expensive to move it where ever they go. Have a radio sewing machine, refrigerator and personal things. They are happy and

doing well

David is expecting to be drafted. he would like to lease a garage as he has both electric and acetylene welding equipment and is an excellent mechanic.

I am sorry you are so shut in. We don't spend half enough time writing to you.

We are just 20 miles from Billings where we sell sweet cream. We have electricity, irrigation, school busses and rural mail route so we are conveniently located. The cream truck picks up our cream every other day. we get checks every two weeks. The children go to school in Worden 5 mi. east.
